SOCIAL FARMING PARTICIPANTS & SERVICES INSIGHTS

Three individual's from Avista day service attended a placement on Hanarahan's farm in North Tipperary

The Hanrahan Farm is located at the foothills of the Devil's Bit. It is a small farm where they keep sucklers, free-range hens, and their dog, Bounty. They have a kitchen garden and a large polytunnel where they grow a large variety of vegetables and fruits. They also have an orchard and flower gardens.

The individuals that attended the farm increased some of their skills which would give them opportunities to enter the world of work. Skills that they learned included: Timekeeping, timing, following directions, the ability to carry out tasks in a certain way, the importance of Health & Safety, and communication with two individuals increased, just to mention some.

The friendships that were created will be ongoing. The participants constantly talked about their placement and really enjoyed going each week.

One individual since this placement has secured a part-time job working in the local mart canteen, prior to this placement, the mart would not have been considered as an option, however seeing how many and skills he learned on the farm, and how much he enjoyed it - it proved to be the perfect fit!

"I really enjoyed working with the animals, feeding them and looking after them. I learned a lot about how to look after the health and welfare of the animals, which was good experience to get. I always had good craic with the farmer and enjoyed having a coffee and a chat. I found being involved in social farming helped with my mental health also and gave me something to look forward to each week. I look forward to going again in 2024."

Creagh Training Centre is a HSE-run centre in Ballinasloe which provides communitybased services for clients with mental health needs and those with an intellectual disability. They recently supported three people for placements on the farm of Blaithnaid and Niall Gallagher near Aughrim.

The whole social farming concept has huge potential and Creagh Training Centre hopes to offer this programme to more of its trainees in the near future.

RESEARCH & POLICY ACTIVITY

We were delighted to host our partners from Germany, the Netherlands and the Czech Republic for our final Project meeting of the Erasmus+ SoFarTEAM project which took place in Carrick-on-Shannon at the end of June. It was a great opportunity for the partners to experience the Irish family farm model of social farming on the ground. At Pat & Anne Bradleys, Tommy Earley's, and Paul Kelly's farms, we had it all! Sun, torrential rain, music, delicious food, exceptionally contented cows, bogs, nature, lakeside beauty and many, many fantastic exchanges of ideas and experiences.

The brilliant outputs from this Project have been distributed to our social farmers and are now available for all to use and benefit from on our website <u>here.</u> Our farmer readers will be especially interested in the four-page guides to working with individual target groups – they are eminently practical and user-friendly and based on the real-world knowledge and experience of farmers and others working in the sector.





In 2022 our Policy officer Aisling was appointed as the Coordinating Expert of the EIP Agri/EU CAP Network Focus Group on Social Farming and Innovation. This Focus Group brought together 20 experts from 13 different EU countries and provided an opportunity to share learning and insights on Social Farming and to highlight its importance as a social and economic innovation at EU level. Brian Smyth, Social Farming Ireland Project Manager was selected as one of the experts. The Final Report and associated Mini-papers were published in December 2023 and are now available to download and read here. We are thrilled to have been part of this process and to have been able to place the Irish perspective and experience right at the centre of the conversation at European level.

A key pillar of the work of our Policy Officer Aisling is building knowledge of Social Farming amongst the next generation of health and social care professionals. So far this academic year, she has delivered seminars to social care students at SETU Waterford as part of their Interprofessional Practice and Education week, at TUS (Athlone) and at ATU (Sligo). A huge thank you to the lecturers for facilitating this important engagement with students – these are lively sessions which bring innovative practice right into the classroom.







SOCIAL FARMING AWARENESS WEEK

Social Farming Ireland was delighted to have participated in the second annual all Ireland Social Farming Awareness Week from the 2nd to the 6th October!

During this week 5 Farms hosted exciting open days on their farms:

- National Social Farming Awareness Week 2023 kicked off very successfully in Carrigaline with an Open Day on Louise O'Mahony's beautiful and very diverse farm. Louise farms alongside her husband and three children and the whole family plus dogs, goats and assorted other animals were there to welcome a crowd of over 60 people to the farm on the day.
- On Tuesday for the second day of National Social Farming Awareness Week Richard & Áine Galway held a very successful Open Day on their beautiful farm outside of Thomastown in Kilkenny. It was a great gathering of participants, services, neighbours, friends and farmers, some of whom had travelled from as far as Waterford, Tipperary and Kildare. All were keen to gain an insight into what Social Farming is all about and to what the Galway's farm has to offer to participants.
- On Wednesday there was a wonderful atmosphere of positivity and inclusion at Alan and Vivian Wood's farm on the shores of Lough Conn in Crossmalina as they opened their gates as part of Social Farming Awareness Week 2023. Alan has been a farmer his whole life. Vivian is a great community person and baker, which the attendees at the Open Day can happily attest to having gotten to sample her delicious home-made scones.
- On Thursday, Social farmers Violet & Stephen Kavanagh opened their beautiful sheep farm. The weather was mixed but the dramatic unspoilt beauty of the location and warm hearty welcome more than made up for the persistent rain showers. The event was widely attended, attracting a range of people from participants, to service providers, to people wanting to become involved in Social Farming and even a large group of Transition Year students who travelled from Good Counsel College in New Ross, Co. Wexford with their teacher Kieran Barron!
- National Social Farming Awareness Week 2023 ended with what turned out to be the biggest event of the week, an Open Day at Quarryfield Farm near Tubbercurry in Sligo attended by almost 100 people. Training


